PARTY CITY AGREES TO "BAN THE BOX" **IN NEW YORK**

For answers to your legal National retailer Party City has agreed to "Ban the Box" for job questions, feel free to contact applicants in New York as part of a settlement reached with Attorney General Eric Schneiderman. The settlement was Jason Ulatowski, Esq. at reached following an investigation by the Attorney General's Office that uncovered that Party City illegally discriminated against individuals with prior felony convictions. A Party City human resources employee said at a job fair that the

> company did not hire people with felony convictions to full time positions, and this statement later was corroborated by a manager at a Party City located in New York City.

New York law prohibits certain employers from discriminating against applicants based on prior criminal convictions. In order to deny employment because of a criminal conviction, the employer must weigh factors set forth in New York's Correction Law to determine whether the applicant's conviction has a direct relationship to the position sought or whether the applicant poses a safety risk to property, specific individuals, or the general public. An employer's determination that the applicant's conviction has a direct relationship to the position or that the applicant poses a safety risk will allow the employer to legally deny employment.

Party City failed to follow New York law when it outright refused to hire people with prior felony convictions to full time positions. As a result, Party City agreed to revise its hiring policies and procedures, including "Banning the Box" on job applications; conduct employee training regarding its hiring processes; conduct outreach and recruiting efforts with organizations specializing in job training and rehabilitation of individuals with criminal records; reconsider hundreds of former applications of individuals who may wrongly have

been denied employment; submit periodic reports to show compliance with New York law; and pay a \$95,000 fine.

Party City's agreement to "Ban the Box" follows a growing trend of cities and states that have passed legislation to preclude employers from asking about an applicant's criminal history on job applications. More than 10 states and 60 cities, including Buffalo and Rochester, have "Banned the Box," and this list is certain to grow in the future.

Practice Pointer: Employers should be diligent in checking state and local laws in order to ensure compliance with any "Ban the Box" legislation. New York employers must be sure never to disgualify an applicant based solely on a criminal conviction, just as employment cannot be denied because of sex, race, or other protected characteristics, even if "Ban the Box" legislation is not in place.
